

Eagleby State School Uniform Policy

Approved Uniform Items:

Eagleby State School polo shirt (with logo)
Formal checked shirt or dress
Senior polo (Years 4–6) and Year 6 maroon senior shirt
Music shirt (for music students only)
Bottle green shorts or skorts
Bottle green or white/black skivvies, jumpers, or jackets
Tracksuit pants and leggings (bottle green or black)
Predominantly black or white shoes with matching socks
Eagleby State School or ARTIE bucket hat
House shirts for sporting events

Hats:

All students must wear a bucket hat for sun safety. Caps are not permitted. Students without a hat will be asked to remain in shaded areas during breaks.

Jewellery, Hair & Appearance:

- Up to two sets of small earrings
- A watch (with smart functions disabled)
- Natural hair colours only; no tracks or extensions
- Neat hair that doesn't cover eyes
- No acrylic nails or coloured nail polish (natural colours only)
- Face paint only for special events
- Cultural/religious jewellery is permitted if worn discreetly

Not Permitted:

- Hooded jumpers or shirts
- Inappropriate slogans or clothing on free dress days
- Makeup or fashion nails
- Non-approved hats or accessories

Free Dress and Special Events

On Free Dress Days, students must still wear sun-safe clothing, and all choices must reflect our school values. No hoodies or offensive/inappropriate graphics are permitted.

Student Eligibility for Camps, Excursions, and Extra Activities

As part of our broader Student Code of Conduct, we have also clarified our Eligibility Policy for participation in camps, excursions, and special programs. To ensure fairness and uphold our high standards, students must:

- Maintain 90% attendance (excluding approved extenuating circumstances)
- Uphold our school values of Strength, Ownership, Aspiration, and Relationships
- Demonstrate consistent positive behaviour
- Meet uniform expectations as outlined above

Eligibility is reviewed regularly, and families will be informed if any concerns arise. We value working in partnership with parents and carers to ensure every student can participate and thrive.
